

Role of a BEANZ Regional Representative

The role of a Regional Representative requires you to represent Biology Teachers from your region by:



- Attending meetings. There could be 2 or 3 of these a year, most by zoom but at least 1 face to face (usually in Wellington - flights and travel expenses are reimbursed).
- If possible, attending Biolive/Chem Ed or Scicon conferences, with registration and transport costs paid by BEANZ.
- Running a regional workshop in your region (BEANZ can support you with delivery until you gain confidence). Some run these in term 4, some in term 1, up to you. Some also run clusters in other terms at member request. The content is developed by regional reps at their hui, often inspired by conference.
- Being a point of contact for teachers within your region- either by directly supporting them or passing their needs on to us so we can help as a wider network. For this you need a contact list, hopefully passed on by your predecessor.
- Being a general voice for your region to BEANZ exec, to raise what's working well or what the challenges are in your region.
